

Bound by Simpson and Renshaw with their ticket pasted on to the rear paste down. Embossed stamp on title page noting "presented by the publisher." The first half of the book is a travel account of Dresser's time in Japan written with his designer's eye. The second half reviews the ways design and decoration were used in Japanese manufacturing including architectural motifs, floral symbols etc used in lacquer ware ceramics metal work and fabrics. Book by the typographer and journalist Joseph Thorp (1873-1962) offering independent polemical notes on taste, the traditions of Heals as a source of good taste in design and "directing inspiration" Lovely wood block full page illustrations throughout. Thorp moved from working at the Arden Press. He was involved in the Curwen Press and wrote later in life a biography of Eric Gill. [Ref: 22172] \$130

The undated 6th edition was current for many years in the later years of the nineteenth century and the early years of the twentieth, but no one now seems to be sure precisely when it was first published [The British Library gives the dates 1882-83 for the 6th edition.] The second volume an incredible source for decorative items such as garden and park benches, band stands, loggias etc. Small paper bound 16mo book with card wrappers, this gives prices for items in volume I of 6th edition. 68pp,



A handbook for modest commercial and amateur craftsmen. Five editions between c.1874 and c.1877. Covers Mouldings; Picture and Looking-glass Frames; Plate Glass; Silvering Plate Glass; Composition Ornaments; Gilder's Tools; Preparations Used in Gilding; Gilding; Interior and Exterior Gilding; Cleaning and Restoration of Oil Paintings; Picture Frames and Their Manufacture, mitring, mounting etc. Whilst not uncommon it is hard to find in this condition. 6. SCULLY Richard. Picture Frames

London Published by the firm. 1910 83pp catalogue. Large format images of picture frame mouldings for hanging in a workshop and linked to it a 16pp and price list with yellow wrappers. Flimsy cloth wrappers protect the contents. First page dusty and last a little nibbled at edges else very good. The Company were established picture and looking glass framemakers; from 1880,



wholesale composition and fancy wood picture frame moulding manufacturer. Richard Scully (c.1832-1912) was born in the parish of St Luke Old St in about 1832. It was later claimed that he established his business as early as 1850 (see Who's Who in Art, 1934, p.ii). Scully married Louisa Johnson (c.1833-1913) in the Poplar district in 1855. He was recorded at 118 Church Road in Canonbury in successive censuses as a picture framemaker, or simply as a framemaker, in 1871 as age 37, with his wife Louisa and sons Frederick, age 13, and George, age 2, in 1881 as age 49, with his wife and five sons and daughters, in 1891 as age 58, with two sons in the business, and in 1911 by now retired, with his wife and a daughter. Richard Scully died age 79 on 30 August 1912, described as a picture frame mouldings manufacturer, leaving effects worth the considerable sum of £20,847 (The Times 24 January 1913; National Probate Calendar). firm., William Young established a business as a building and decorating merchant at 5 Romford Road, Stratford, in East London in 1872. He was later joined by Harry Holdich Marten to form the company of Young & Marten in 1900. As well as selling building and decorating materials, Young & Marten manufactured joinery and leaded light windows. Young & Marten Ltd. traded until at least the early 1970s. [Ref: 19652] \$175




C A Busby b 1786 made his name as a Regency Architect in Brighton. He was articled to Daniel Asher Alexander, then graduated from the Royal Academy schools with a gold medal in 1807. In 1817-19 he studied in North America. Returning to the UK he was active in Brighton designing firstly Kemp Town to the east of the centre then the western extension of the town known as Brunswick Town, which he spent his last decade designing. This title was published in the year of his death. Undoubtedly a fitting memorial to an architect who was so active in shaping Brighton's architectural legacy. The prince Regent popularised Brighton through his spectacular development of Brighton Pavilion, firstly by Henry Holland then John Nash in the 1820s. This book gives a flavour of the Regency design style so popular with George, who became King in 1820 and his court guests and society of the day. Busby published a much earlier pattern book in 1808 A Series of Designs for Villas and Country Houses adapted with economy to the comforts and to the elegancies of modern life with plans and explanations to each. Limp calf, gilt, a little worn, rebacked. Henry 549, Harris 117. This treatise was conceived as a response to the landscape gardening style of Capability Brown. It was first published in 1772 both in English and French and was especially influential on the Continent. Its publication invoked a response of a satiric and heroic epistle by Mason which is included here. Note in hand writing of Cripps Day listing publications by the same author and also on the front paste down stamp of the Rohamsted Experimental Station. [Ref: 19798] \$1650







Considered to be the best edition with a supplement containing Palladio's Orders of Architecture. Richardson was a pupil of Sir John Soane, from 1824 to 1830 then became Soane's assistant until Soane's death in 1837 after which he became Master at the Somerset House Architecture school. Perkins devised a high-pressure system of hot-water heating in 1831 which used a solid-fuel-fired brick furnace or metal chamber containing a sinuous coil of small-bore seam-welded wrought iron pipe. 



There are a couple of ink annotations [approximately contemporary with the publication] alongside the English text. This privately printed edition was printed for Walpole on his press at Strawberry Hill in an edition of 400 copies, 200 to be offered to the author's friends, and 200 for the Duke of Nivernais, the translator. The French translation is opposite the English text. The Duke of Nivernais was seeking to spread in France the English landscape style. Emma McEvoy discusses the relationship between the Duke of Nivernais and Horace Walpole in "Gothic Tourism" 2016 in her case study of Strawberry Hill. This essay was first printed at Mr. Walpole's private press at Strawberry Hill in 1771, when it appeared at the end of the fourth volume of 'Anecdotes of painting in England' under the title: 'The modern taste in gardening'. This edition is the first separate edition of the essay. Charles Ballantyne, 1903-, of the Sandbed House, Yarrow, Selkirk, Scotland.
