Documents one of the most important former sanatoria in England, designed by H. Percy Adams and Charles Holden, and one of the most attractive. Latterly the King Edward VII Hospital, it closed in 2006 and remained empty for some years after. The sanatorium building and chapel were listed Grade II\* and the gardens registered, [laid out by Gertrude Jekyll] conferring a degree of protection for these important buildings and imposing restrictions on the re-use and redevelopment of the site but currently being converted for housing. York 1936 Original drawing. 920x600mm Framed behind glass. Slight foxing and a small muddy smudge on drafting paper else very good. Perspective illustrating one of a number of hotel/public houses proposed for York's new housing estates by the Brewers J J Hunt Ltd. This one situated at the junction Crichton Avenue and Kingsway North, York, adjacent to shops opposite the Catholic Church which marked another corner of the junction. It would have served the aborted "outer ring road" scheme planned to follow the line of Kingsway as well as the adjacent Kingsway housing scheme. Demolished c2000.

The only surviving Needham pub/hotel in York, of its kind, is the Ainsty on Poppleton Road, York. This too would have served a portion of the proposed ring road. J. J. Hunt was founded in the 1830s in York, and in various guises, continued till 1956. After 1927 one of the strategies for expansion of the Brewery was to build new public houses to serve the suburbs. Samuel Needham (a leading influence on early twentieth century pub design in York) was president of the York & Yorkshire Architectural Society was responsible for the design of what were effectively "road house" for the proposed road but which also served the expanding suburbs. He initially worked for Tadcaster Breweries but set up on his own in c1904. His son, Charles, also trained as an architect and moved from Leicester, where he had been City Architect, to join the practice in 1927. http://breweryhistory.com/wiki/index.php?title=John J. two external views of the building and six interiors including one of the entrance hall, with a display of products including Bisto and Cerebos products, five showing the offices including one showing staff at work. Undated but inter-war. Mounted on stiff card. Some edges worn and looks like they may have been removed from frames at some point. Portsmouth, no date, c 1940 -1948. Twenty-six black and white photographs pasted into a period album + three additional photographs of the same subjects loosely inserted. Landscape shaped album with cloth covered boards. Embossed circle on upper boards. Boards worn and dusty and rear inner hinge detached. Mostly images are of St Cuthbert and St Aidan Church, Portsmouth. 16 black and white photographs of the Church. Three show the interior before damage occurred and 13 afterwards. A further four photographs show the local community; one of which is a post war street party. There are additionally five small photographs of the church hall which operated as a church during the war. One shows a bombed-out house. Photograph sizes vary from 260x210mm to small scale images 55 x 85mm [of the hall]. Several photographs have the embossed stamp of "Portsmouth and Sunderland Newspapers Ltd.". Two images show memorials of flowers set up in the damaged church and further one is a miniature cenotaph. These are particularly interesting for their documentary value of commemorating the impact of war damage. Fascinating album. Photographs all very good but some poorly pasted into the album. No captions. Album itself, worn but a great record of one building and its associated community. This church was damaged twice. The first damage to the church buildings occurred on November 10th 1940, when a high explosive bomb fell, tore a hole in the North side of the nave. On April 17th 1941, a landmine in

Hayling Avenue destroyed the East end of the church, severely damaging the rest of the building and completely flattening

the Parish Hall (the original Mission Church). The church was initially partially restored and then further work was undertaken in 1957. In the early 2000s the church was partially converted to house several community facilities including a doctor's surgery. All these changes are documented at

Photographs show staff, equipment and process and materials. Last few images show trade stand for N M Rothschild & Sons Royal Mint Refinery c 1952 at the Castle Bromwich Exhibition. Superb realist images of equipment and machinery preceded by three photographs of the management staff sitting in rows. A few images within the main body of the album show staff at work.
