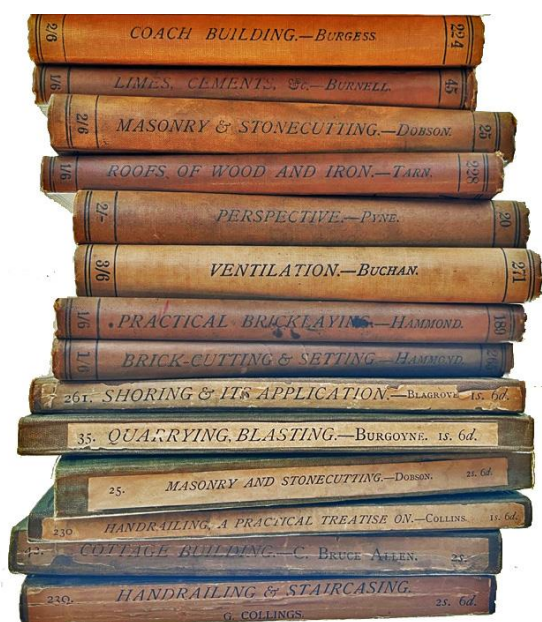

### Supplement to Hand List 121

English publisher John Weale (1791 – 1862) published the first title in his *Rudimentary Series* in 1849. Over 130 titles followed, usually selling at one shilling each and covering a wide range of topics across Science, Art and Education, and aimed at students, apprentices and elf-taught individuals. Between 1881 and 1923 *Weale's Scientific & Technical Series* was issued, first published by Weale's and later taken on by Crosby Lockwood & Sons Ltd, who retained the original system of reference numbers. The entire series, of which there were over 300 titles, was constantly revised and updated to include the latest discoveries in scientific research and theory, with some titles reaching their fourteenth edition.

Below is offered a selection of some of the titles, presented alphabetically by Author, in Weale's *Rudimentary Series* and his later *Scientific and Technical Series*. Unless otherwise highlighted, these items all include catalogues lists of new titles from Weale's (usually 16 pages) and from Crosby Lockwood & Sons (c.32 pages) at the end of the main text. They also include adverts in the form of pastedown front end and endpapers (often on blue paper) promoting additional relevant publications in the series. Where an \* is beside a title it infers we have more than one copy.
